

AMERICAN SAMOA DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY (ASDHS)



MISSION STATEMENT:

❖ The mission of the American Samoa Department of Homeland Security is to be the single, Territory-wide focal point for coordinating the Territory's efforts to prevent threats and protect the lives and property of all people living in American Samoa during emergencies or disaster events.



EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER (EOC):

 The EOC is the centralized location of emergency response and recovery support operations during incidents. While tactical on-scene operations are conducted from the Incident Command Post (ICP), the EOC supports and helps coordinate ICP operations and any other adjacent incident operations.

ROLE:

The Emergency Operations Center (EOC) serves a critical role in every phase of emergency management, from being the hub for all coordination during an incident to facilitating and directing recovery/clean-up. However, the EOC does not manage an incident — it coordinates.



EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER (EOC): COMMAND & STRUCTURE

- The EOC utilizes the Incident Command System (ICS) as the command-and-control structure. Within this structure, the EOC is organized into four sections to manage operations. These EOC sections include:
 - Operations: This section represents on-scene emergency responders and provides coordination between the EOC and field operations, including the ICP.
 - Planning: This section is responsible for receiving, evaluating and analyzing all disaster information and providing updated status reports to EOC management and field operations.
 - Logistics: Logistics is responsible for procuring supplies, personnel and material support necessary to conduct emergency responses (e.g. personnel call-out, equipment acquisition, lodging, transportation, food, etc.).
 - Finance: This section handles cost accountability, purchase authorizations, documentation and risk assessment.



EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER (EOC): CHAIN OF COMMAND

GOVERNOR OF AMERICAN SAMOA	The ONLY authority that can activate and de-activate the EOC.
GOVERNOR'S AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE (GAR)	Designated by the Governor to execute all necessary documents for disaster assistance programs on behalf of the State/Territory and local grant recipients. The GAR is responsible for State compliance with the FEMA-State Agreement.
TERRITORIAL CORDINATING OFFICER (TCO)	Designated by the Governor to coordinate State/Territory and local disaster assistance efforts with that of the Federal government.
INCIDENT COMMANDER (IC)	Responsible for all aspects of an emergency response; including developing incident objectives, managing all incident operations, application of resources as well as responsibility for all persons involved.
SECTION CHIEFS	Heads of the Operations, Planning, Logistics & Finance sections.
EMERGENCY SUPPORT FUNCTIONS (ESFs)	Organized groups of government and private-sector entities that provide personnel, supplies, facilities and equipment used in a response.



- * THREAT, HAZARD IDENTIFICATION, AND RISK ASSESSMENT (THIRA)/STATE PREPAREDNESS REPORT (SPR)
- DEVELOP TRAINING AND EXERCISE PLAN
- *** CONDUCT TRAINING, WORKSHOPS AND EXERCISES TO IDENTIFY ANY GAPS AND SHORTFALLS IN RESPONSE PLANS**
- UTILIZE EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS GRANT PROGRAM FUNDING TO ADDRESS IDENTIFIED GAPS AND SHORTFALLS



- *** ACCOUNTABILITY**





