



HUMAN TRAFFICKING AWARENESS

WHAT IS HUMAN TRAFFICKING?

- Is a form of **modern-day slavery** where traffickers profit from the control and exploitation of their victims
- Is a highly profitable global criminal enterprise, generating billions of dollars in annual profits

Guide to Human Trafficking Law in American Samoa

- ▶ There is three main crimes specified by the law that covers human trafficking. 1. Human Trafficking is: Depriving or violating the personal liberty of another with intent to obtain forced labor or services, or commercial sex acts.
- ▶ 2. Involuntary Servitude: Hold or attempt to hold any person in involuntary servitude or owning another person. Holding, assuming, or
- ▶ attempting to assume. Ownership rights over any person or assisting in any matter. Violating the provision of this statute.
- ▶ 3.Trafficking of a minor is any person who causes, induces, or persuades, or attempts to cause a person who is a minor to perform forced labor to engage in commercial sex act. Human Trafficking: Class B felony, punishable by 5 to 15 years in prison, unless the victim is a minor, in
- ▶ which case, is a Class A felony punishable by 10 to 30 years in prison without probation or parole.
- ▶ Involuntary: Class C Felony, punishable to seven years in prison, a fine of \$5,000, or both such fine and imprisonment.
- ► Trafficking of a Minor: The Sentence of imprisonment must include a prison term of at least 10 years. This prison term is served without a probation or parole.

WHITE COLLAR CRIME

Definition of White Collar Crime:

- White-collar crime is a specific type of criminal activity involving nonviolent offenses that typically have financial motivations. Unlike other forms of criminal activity, there is no physical force or threat to others in the commission of a white-collar crime.
- While it does not typically involve violence, it can have devastating consequences for victims, businesses, and the economy. Typically people with white-collar jobs commit such crimes. Thus it is called white-collar crime. These are people who work in office settings and have professional positions. Usually, victims may not even know they are victims of such crimes. They may know only months or years later when the law identifies the perpetrator.
